THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF GEORGINA IN THE REGIONAL MUNICIPALITY OF YORK

BY-LAW NUMBER 2008-0138 (REG-1)

BEING A BY-LAW TO PROVIDE FOR THE CONTROL OF AGGRESSIVE/DANGEROUS DOGS IN THE TOWN OF GEORGINA

WHEREAS Clause 6 of Section 11(2) of the Municipal Act 2001, as amended, authorizes a lower tier municipality to pass by-laws respecting the health, safety and well-being of persons;

AND WHEREAS Clause 8 of Section 11(2) of the Municipal Act 2001, as amended, authorizes a lower tier municipality to pass by-laws respecting the protection of persons and property;

AND WHEREAS Clause 9 of Section 11(3) of the Municipal Act 2001, as amended, authorizes a lower tier municipality to pass by-laws respecting animals.

NOW THEREFORE THE COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF GEORGINA ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

1.0 **DEFINITIONS**:

In this by-law,

- 1.1 "aggressive dog" means a dog that individually or in the accompaniment of another dog(s) chases or approaches a person or domestic animal in such a manner that the person or domestic animal owner has reasonable grounds to believe that they or their domestic animal is in imminent danger, including but not limited to, hostile behaviour or incident such as growling or snarling at a person or domestic animal.
- 1.2 "Aggressive/Dangerous Dog Declaration" means a signed declaration in the form attached hereto as Schedule "A", attested to and completed in its entirety by a witness who actually saw aggressive or dangerous dog behaviour or incident.
- 1.3 "Aggressive/Dangerous Dog Order" means an order in the form attached hereto as Schedule "B", designating the dog as aggressive or dangerous and requiring the dog to be muzzled and restrained in accordance with this by-law.
- 1.4 "Animal Control Supervisor" means a person appointed as such by the Town or their designate.
- 1.5 "Appeal Committee" means a committee comprised of three (3) persons appointed by Town Council.
- 1.6 "at large" means being found, while not under control by the dog owner, any place other than the premises of the dog owner.
- 1.7 "Chief Municipal Law Enforcement Officer" means a person appointed as such by the Town or their designate.
- 1.8 "dangerous dog" means a dog that, either individually or in the accompaniment of another dog(s):
 - has, in the absence of any mitigating factor, attacked, bitten, or caused injury to a person; or
 - (b) has, in the absence of any mitigating factor, injured a domestic animal; or

- (c) having previously been designated as an "aggressive dog", is kept or permitted to be kept in violation of the requirements as set in Section 3.1 of this by-law.
- 1.9 "dog owner" means a person who owns, possesses, harbours or has permanent or temporary possession of a dog, and where the owner is a minor, the person responsible for the custody of the minor.
- 1.10 "domestic animal" means a horse, dog or any other animal that is kept under human control or by habit or training lives in association with human beings and in compliance with the by-law regulating and prohibiting the keeping of animals other than dogs.
- 1.11 "microchip implant" means an electronic device implanted under the skin of a dog whereby the animal can be identified by local authorities.
- 1.12 "mitigating factor" means a circumstance that excuses dangerous behaviour of a dog and, without limiting the generality of the foregoing, may include:
 - (a) aggressive behaviour while acting in defence of an attack by a person or domestic animal; or
 - (b) aggressive behaviour while acting in defence of its young or reacting to a person or domestic animal trespassing on the property of its owner; or
 - aggressive behaviour resulting from being teased, provoked or tormented.
- 1.13 "muzzle" means a humane fastening or covering device of adequate strength and design, suitable to the breed of dog, that fits over the mouth of a dog, that can not be removed by the dog, so as to prevent the dog from biting or attacking a person or domestic animal.
- 1.14 "police work dog" means a dog trained for and actually engaged in law enforcement for the police or other person duly appointed as a peace officer.
- 1.15 "property owner" means the person(s) currently listed as such on the assessment roll of the town.
- 1.16 "Town" means the Corporation of the Town of Georgina.
- 1.17 "Town Clerk" means a person appointed as such or their designate.
- 1.18 "trespassing" means the uninvited, unwelcome or unauthorized entering onto another person's property without permission of the owner or without lawful authority.

2.0 GENERAL PROVISIONS:

2.1 Aggressive or Dangerous Dog Designation

(a) Upon receipt of an Aggressive/Dangerous Dog Declaration, the Chief Municipal Law Enforcement Officer, being satisfied that grounds exist, shall designate the dog in question as an aggressive or dangerous dog.

- (b) If feasible, within 5 days of receipt of the aforementioned declaration, the Chief Municipal Law Enforcement Officer shall cause personal service and/or the registered mailing of the Aggressive/Dangerous Dog Order to the dog owner. A copy of the Order shall also be forwarded to the property owner, if applicable.
- (c) Where a dog has been designated as aggressive or dangerous the dog owner may request a hearing before the Appeal Committee as required by Section 105 of the Municipal Act 2001, as amended. The hearing request must be in writing and received by the Chief Municipal Law Enforcement Officer within 30 days of issuance of the Aggressive/Dangerous Dog Order.
- (d) Upon receipt of the appeal request and payment of the required appeal hearing fee, the Chief Municipal Law Enforcement Officer shall convene a meeting of the Appeal Committee and shall give the dog owner, the property owner, if applicable, and witness(s) to the aggressive or dangerous dog incident 7 days written notice by personal service and/or registered mail of the date, time and location of the appeal.
- (e) Notwithstanding that a dog owner has requested an appeal before the Appeal Committee, Sections 3.1 (a), (b), (c), and (d)(i) of the Aggressive/Dangerous Dog Bylaw remain in effect until the Appeal Committee has rendered its decision or the expiration of 30 days from the issuance date of the Order.
- (f) The Appeal Committee shall be governed by the Statutory Powers Procedure Act as amended.
- (g) The applicant and any other interested person may appear at the appeal hearing to present evidence relating to the dog in question.
- (h) If the dog owner fails to attend at the proper time and place, the Appeal Committee may proceed with the appeal hearing in his or her absence and the applicant shall not be entitled to any further notice of the proceeding.
- (i) The Appeal Committee shall deliberate the merits of the evidence presented and shall render a decision at the appeal hearing or shall reserve the decision to be presented later, not more than 10 days from the date of the appeal hearing.
- (j) The Appeal Committee may confirm the Aggressive/ Dangerous Dog Order or exempt the dog owner from any or all restrictions of the Order.
- (k) The decision of the Appeal Committee is final and binding.

(I) A written decision of the Appeal Committee shall be prepared as soon as practical following the conclusion of the appeal hearing and a copy shall be sent by regular mail to the dog owner, the property owner, if applicable, and to the Aggressive/Dangerous Dog Declaration witness(s) at their last known address, and also to York Regional Police, York Region Health Services, the Animal Control Supervisor, the Chief Municipal Law Enforcement Officer, Town Council members, Appeal Committee members and the Town Clerk.

3.0 GENERAL PROHIBITIONS

3.1 Designated Aggressive Dog Restrictions

Every owner of an aggressive dog shall:

- (a) License the dog annually with the Town in accordance with the by-law providing for the licensing of dogs.
- (b) Not allow the dog to be at large.
- (c) Restrain the dog when off the property as follows:

(i) fitted with a muzzle as defined; and

- (ii) fitted with a leash, not more than 1.83 metres (6') in length, properly secured to a collar or harness, all of which are strong enough to prevent the dog from breaking away, and
- (iii) controlled by a person not less than 16 years of age.
- (d) Restrain the dog when on the property as follows:

inside the dog owner's dwelling; or

- (ii) within a yard that is entirely enclosed by a fence not less than 1.83 metres (6') high equipped with a lockable self closing, self latching gate that can not be opened from the outside by a child less than 10 years of age and constructed so as to prevent the dog from escaping.
- (e) Infix the dog with a microchip implant.
- (f) Sterilize the dog before the age of 6 months or within 30 days of the dog being designated as aggressive. The dog owner shall provide proof of sterilization immediately upon request of the Chief Municipal Law Enforcement Officer.
- (g) Display "Beware of Dog(s)" warning signs, in a conspicuous place, at all entrances to the property indicating the presence of an aggressive dog.
- (h) Comply with the terms of the Aggressive/Dangerous Dog Order as amended.

3.2 <u>Designated Dangerous Dog Restrictions</u>

Every owner of a dangerous dog shall:

 (a) Comply with all restrictions as noted in Section 3.1 of this by-law.

- (b) In addition to the yard fencing requirements noted in Section 3.1(d)(ii), keep the Dangerous Dog fitted with a muzzle, as defined, at all times when not secured within the dog owner's dwelling.
- (c) Produce proof of liability insurance coverage in the amount of not less than \$25,000, to the Chief Municipal Law Enforcement Officer, for any injuries to a person or domestic animal caused by the Dangerous Dog.
- (d) Surrender the Dangerous Dog to the Town animal shelter for humane euthanasia when the dog owner is unable or unwilling to meet the requirements of this by-law.

4.0 EXEMPTIONS:

4.1 This by-law shall not apply to a police work dog.

5.0 **ENFORCEMENT**:

- 5.1 The provisions of this by-law shall be enforced by a Municipal Law Enforcement Officer.
- 5.2 In accordance with Section 436 of the Municipal Act 2001, as amended, a Municipal Law Enforcement Officer may enter property to determine if the terms of this by-law are being met.

6.0 - PENALTIES:

6.1 Every person who contravenes any of the provisions of this by-law, upon conviction, is guilty of an offence and is liable to a fine pursuant to the Provincial Offences Act, as amended.

7.0 REPEALS:

7.1 By-law 2007-0102 (REG-1) is hereby repealed.

The corporation of the Town of Georgina is in receipt of a Declaration duly executed by the Chief Municipal Law Enforcement Officer pursuant to Section 2.1 (a) of By-law No. 2008-0138 (REG-1), stating that the dog described above, on the day of , 20 , did

In accordance with Section 2.1 of By-law No. 2008-0138 (REG-1) the dog described above is hereby declared as Aggressive Dangerous

As such, in accordance with Section 3.1 of By-law No. 2008-0138 (REG-1), you are hereby ordered to:

- (a) License the dog annually with the Town in accordance with the by-law providing for the licensing of dogs.
- (b) Not allow the dog to be at large.
- (c) Restrain the dog when off the property as follows:
 - (i) fitted with a muzzle as defined, and
 - (ii) fitted with a leash, not more than 1.83 metres (6') in length, properly secured to a collar or harness, all of which are strong enough to prevent the dog from breaking away, and
 - (iii) controlled by a person not less than 16 years of age.
- (d) Restrain the dog when on the property as follows:
 - (i) inside the dog owner's dwelling; or
 - (ii) within a yard that is entirely enclosed by a fence not less than 1.83 metres (6') high equipped with a lockable self closing, self latching gate that can not be opened from the outside by a child less than 10 years of age and constructed so as to prevent the dog from escaping.
- (e) Infix the dog with a microchip implant.
- (f) Sterilize the dog before the age of 6 months or within 30 days of being designated as aggressive. The dog owner shall provide proof of sterilization immediately upon request of the Chief Municipal Law Enforcement Officer.
- (g) Display "Beware of Dog" warning signs, in a conspicuous place, at all entrances to the property indicating the presence of an aggressive dog.
- (h) Comply with the terms of the Aggressive/Dangerous Dog Order as amended.

Furthermore, if your dog has been declared Dangerous, in accordance with Section 3.2 of By-law 2008-0138 (REG-1), you are also hereby ordered to:

- (a) Comply with all restrictions as noted in Section 3.1 of By-law No. 2008-0138 (REG-1).
- (b) In addition to the yard fencing requirements noted in Section 3.1(d)(ii), keep the Dangerous Dog filled with a muzzle, as defined, when not secured within the dog owner's dwelling.
- (c) Produce proof of liability insurance in the amount of not less than \$25,000, to the Chief Municipal Law Enforcement Officer, for any injuries to a person or domestic animal caused by the Dangerous Dog.
- (d) Surrender the Dangerous Dog to the Town animal shelter for humane euthanasia when the owner is unable or unwilling to meet the requirements of this by-law.

Request for a hearing before the Appeal Committee

In accordance with Section 2.1(c) of By-law No. 2008-0138 (REG-1), you may request a hearing before the Appeal Committee by submitting a written request, but such request must be received by the Town within 30 days of the date of this order. A cheque or money order in the amount of \$100.00 made payable to the "Town of Georgina" must accompany the appeal request. The appeal request must be addressed to the Town of Georgina, attention to the Chief Municipal Law Enforcement Officer, 26557 Civic Centre Road, Keswick, ON, L4P 3G1.

Take notice that, notwithstanding that a dog owner has requested an appeal before the Appeal Committee, Sections 3.1 (a), (b), (c), and (d)(i) of the Aggressive/Dangerous Dog By-law remain in effect until the Appeal Committee has rendered its decision or the expiration of 30 days from the issuance date of this Order.

On September 28th, my mom, my dad, my daughter Finlay and I were going to my brother's place for a barbecue in Jackson's Point with his girlfriend Natasha. When we got there, we were greeted by all three dogs, gizmo and Hank; we set her hellos, and my mom and dad in Finlay decided to go to the beach to enjoy the last Beach day. I spoke up back to the house. Finlay and I were cleaning the sand between her toes and feet. My mom and dad went out with my brother to start the bonfire. Natasha, my brother's girlfriend, Finlay, and I stayed in the residence. Finlay snuggled with Minnie in the living room as we dried our feet. Natasha and I were in the kitchen getting a drink to sit in the living room with Finlay. I asked if Natasha could get a phone charger to charge my phone. It was currently dead. As I started to go around the corner, I heard screams of my child screaming bloody murder. I turned as quickly as I could see Hank's jaw on my daughter's skull, whipping her down to the ground and locking his jaw on her skull as she continued to scream out loudly in pain. The unbearable horror I saw my daughter's face must have been going through at that time. I saw the pain she must feel unbearable to witness as a mother. Handsome mother, no mother should see that whore and your little child's face and have no control over the situation at the mercy of a big animal attacking such an innocent person. The amount of blood that was all over her skull on the floor in the walls was terrifying. From her running away, the screeching of the screens for her little body was horrifying. I grabbed Hank and pushed them off. My daughter picked her up, picking a picture that was covered in blood. It was horrified, not knowing if she was okay. From her face down, her little body was just covered in blood. I was still in shock that that happened. I don't ever recall a Time For That Dog. Hank was aggressive like that, or maybe I haven't been around him as he grew up enough to know him. I knew him as a puppy. He used to come to our house daily as they didn't have daycare for him or their old dog, Davis. When this happened, I panicked and started running to my parents for the keys to drive freshman late to the hospital as my daughter has autism and epilepsy and had a type of traumatic event that just occurred. She needed to seek my medical attention right away. I've been told that if anything happens traumatic to her head, to get her to the house nearest hospital and emergency clinic as soon as possible. A few weeks prior, we were at the beach, and Hank seemed okay but skittish the whole time Hank was swimming with me. There was never a problem with Hank and me always just love, and that's what Hank deserved and deserves. Natasha and even her girlfriend shared with me that a few weeks prior, we were at the beach when an older man came out of the water and attacked Hank. Older man. I am not sure if the police or any other services took it up, but when we were at the beach that day when you sent Hank, he seemed fine. He was with me the whole time because every time I saw him, I gave him the love he deserved, and I just loved that dog that gave me my own. He was like my dream dog; he was so sweet and snuggly. There's the day a week or two before this incident happens when we're all at the beach, and a man comes to the beach. Hank and I were in the water, and immediately, Hank was swimming around me and protecting me. He looked at the man in it as if he was coming near me. Hank started walking up towards him. Nathan and Natasha yelled at Hank to come to me and did not understand why you were so comfortable with it. Now I understand why. So after this happened on September 28th so incident happening in the process of getting my parents to find the keys and getting her into the car to rush to the hospital nathan screamed at hang to get in his crate and Hank Did as soon as Hank lied down in his crate my brother walked over to Hank's Creek and kneeled down next to him and

started punching him as hard as he could hank was at the mercy an abuser I yelled at my brother saying this isn't his doing this is yours this poor dog if I could take him I would all he needs is protection and I yelled at Nathan and his girlfriend Natasha saying I can guarantee you would never do this to many or Gizmo I couldn't just walk away and let this happen to this beautiful dog no animal should be a victim of abuse this hasn't been the first time I've witnessed my brother hurting his dogs I don't understand why he thinks this is okay he needs to get help he's mentally unstable and it's intimidating I feel that Hank needs to seek medical attention to see if there's any broken bones or head trauma or rib trauma or anything to get x-ray love his body into check his behavior he needs he needs out he needs help the fear I saw on his eyes of helplessness as my brothers punching his body in by the strength I would have thought back for him on his behalf. With his old dog, Davis, on numerous occasions, my brother would punch his body if he did something wrong. There were numerous times when he would hit his body so hard that he would pee himself and lie there in his pee. Help this scared. Every time Davis was with me, I protected him. I gave him the love and snuggles that he also deserved. Numerous times, my brother would throw them outside and only hold his collar and his body got choked by his collar as my brother threw him on the deck carrying him only by his collar so he couldn't support his body weight, and it was just dangling in the air. About a year or two ago, after it would have been Davis's second birthday on September 11th, I think on October 14th, I got a phone call from my brother saying Davis was dead. He choked on the Rope toy the same day Dave died. He called my parents nice. Can I please immediately come and bury Davis in the backyard? I find it kind of suspicious the numerous times that he's hurt that dog, and he had an attachment disorder from me. I should have taken him. I feel so much guilt to this day. His dad would eat me alive if I knew that the first thing I would be doing is rushing my dog, regardless if he's already dead, to the vet emergency. Does he know what the cause of death was? I find it very suspicious.

Please help Hank! His body should be checked out by a Vet!

Details of Incident: On September 28th, my mom, my dad, and my daughter Finlay were on our way to my brother Nathan and his girlfriend Natasha's home and Jackson's Point for a barbecue. When we got there, we were greeted by all three dogs: Mini, Gizmo, and Hank. We said our hellos and me my mom my dad and Finlay I decided to go to the beach to enjoy the last Beach day. As we got back the house was busy and Finlay went into the residence to clean off the sand in between our toes and feet, my mom when my dad Paul stayed her back near the bonfire with my brother Nathan, Natasha my brother girlfriend remained inside with us giving us towels to dry your feet Finlay went to go snuggle with Minnie in the living room. Natasha and I were in the kitchen getting a drink after getting a drink I walked out between the living room the kitchen and the dining room to check on Finlay I turned my back for one second to get the charger that I was going to use to charge my phone at that moment I heard the screams of my child screaming bloody murder I turn as quickly as I could to see hank's jaw on my daughter's skull whipping her to the ground and locking his jaw on her skull as she continues to scream out loud in pain. The unbearable horror that my daughter must have been going through at that time. I saw the horror and the pain she was feeling was unbearable. As a mother, no mother should see that whore and you're little child's face of no control over the situation at the mercy of a big animal attack. The amount of blood that was all over her skull on the floor on the walls from her running away the screeching of Screams from her little body was horrifying. Grabbed Hank and pushed him off my daughter picking her little body up which was already covered in blood not knowing if she was okay or not still in shock from what just happened and in so much pain couldn't even breathe I couldn't imagine what she was feeling in that moment. After all of that I ran out to the backyard with Finlay in my hands covered in blood Natasha's crying begging my mom and dad to get the keys and get in the car to take her to the hospital got her in the car finally got to the hospital the fear that she had just to see the doctor because she has autism we were beside ourselves on her behalf also the fear of her having epilepsy and any type of trauma to the head is a huge concern and we've been told to seek medical attention if anything happens to her head. A few weeks prior we were at the beach Hank seemed okay same skittish Hank went swimming with me i've never had a problem in my life with Hank when my brother first got him I helped raise that puppy like he was my own oh God I loved to Hank my dream dog. We took him to the beach he swam with me felt like he was protecting me from anything anyone another person came to the beach he immediately walked for me towards this man who was in the water away from me my brother Nathan and his girlfriend Natasha immediately called

his life every time I saw got out of the water Na	looked at them and then came back to words me and stayed with me all vithat dog all I gave him was love and affection that he deserve. After I tasha and I were talking she told me that a few weeks prior an elderly

The Corporation of the Town of Georgina is in receipt of a Declaration duly executed by the Manager of Municipal Law Enforcement/C.M.L.E.O. pursuant to Section 2.1 (a) of By-law No. 2008-0138 (REG-1), stating that the dog described above, on the 28th day of September, 2024, did demonstrate dangerous behavior. Namely, did bite a child on the top of the head.

In accordance with Section 2.1 of By-law No. 2008-0138 (REG-1) the dog described above is hereby declared as Dangerous.

As such, in accordance with Section 3.1 of By-law No. 2008-0138 (REG-1), you are hereby ordered to:

- (a) License the dog annually with the Town in accordance with the by-law providing for the licensing of dogs.
- (b) Not allow the dog to be at large.
- (c) Restrain the dog when off the property as follows:
 - (i) fitted with a muzzle as defined, and
 - (ii) fitted with a leash, not more than 1.83 metres (6') in length, properly secured to a collar or harness, all of which are strong enough to prevent the dog from breaking away, and
 - (iii) controlled by a person not less than 16 years of age.
- (d) Restrain the dog when on the property as follows:
 - (i) inside the dog owner's dwelling; or
 - (ii) within a yard that is entirely enclosed by a fence not less than 1.83 metres (6') high equipped with a lockable self closing, self latching gate that can not be opened from the outside by a child less than 10 years of age and constructed so as to prevent the dog from escaping.
- (e) Infix the dog with a microchip implant.
- (f) Sterilize the dog before the age of 6 months or within 30 days of being designated as aggressive. The dog owner shall provide proof of sterilization immediately upon request of the Manager of Municipal Law Enforcement/C.M.L.E.,O.
- (g) Display "Beware of Dog" warning signs, in a conspicuous place, at all entrances to the property indicating the presence of an aggressive dog.
- (h) Comply with the terms of the Aggressive/Dangerous Dog Order as amended.

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Furthermore, if your dog has been declared Dangerous, in accordance with Section 3.2 of By-law 2008-0138 (REG-1), you are also hereby ordered to:

- (a) Comply with all restrictions as noted in Section 3.1 of By-law No. 2008-0138 (REG-1).
- (b) In addition to the yard fencing requirements noted in Section 3.1(d)(ii), keep the Dangerous Dog fitted with a muzzle, as defined, when not secured within the dog owner's dwelling.
- (c) Produce proof of liability insurance in the amount of not less than \$25,000, to the Manager of Municipal Law Enforcement/C.M.L.E.O., for any injuries to a person or domestic animal caused by the Dangerous Dog.
- (d) Surrender the Dangerous Dog to the Town animal shelter for humane euthanasia when the dog owner is unable or unwilling to meet the requirements of this bylaw.

Jackie Parker provided a detailed account of the incident involving her dog and the two dogs in question. She explained that she did not wish for the appellants to pay the veterinary bills, understanding that the owners would incur costs due to the orders placed on the dogs. Ms. Parker preferred that any financial contributions from the appellants go towards the costs of installing a fence and fulfilling other aspects of the order.

Councillor Fellini makes a comment regarding the matter.

There were no members of the public present for the appeal meeting.

The appellants made comments regarding the letter from the veterinarian outlining the behavior of the dogs involved. Ms. Munnik also provided additional remarks regarding the incident and the resulting wounds.

Ms. Parker clarified that the photos of the wounds were taken during the healing process and reiterated her desire to prevent a recurrence of the incident.

The committee members discussed the details of the incident and considered the evidence provided.
