Details of Incident: Around noon I was walking on the road of Blue Jays Blvd and a German Shepherd that was on the lawn of the house at 57 Blue Jays Blvd started aggressively barking at me. This dog came right to the edge of its property and was not leashed, which created a lot of stress and anxiety as I felt like it was going to attack me. Later in the day at 1pm, I went for a walk with my sister and her golden retriever that was on a leash. As we were walking in the road on Blue Jays Blvd, the same German shepherd appeared out of nowhere and lunged out onto the street to attack my sister's dog. The German shepherd aggressively bit my sister's golden retriever and wouldn't stop attacking him till the golden retriever barked. We were scared and shocked that this aggressive dog was not on a leash or fenced in. A neighbour came out to say that the dog's owner was not home and there is an invisible fence. There is no reason an aggressive dog should ever be left alone outside without any precautions of a leash, fence, etc. What if that was a young child that he attacked? We were lucky that our golden retriever wasn't badly injured. After we walked away, the German shepherd continued to roam freely in the middle of the street. Once we were a few houses down, another neighbour came out saying that he has always had issues with that dog (named Lincoln) and that it's never leashed or contained. He also said multiple neighbours have had similar problems and people won't even walk down Blue Jays Blvd because of it. Something needs to be done to ensure the safety of others and their pets. It's not safe or fair to the neighbourhood to live in constant fear of being attacked by such an aggressive animal. It's also not fair to the dog itself, who should be properly taken care of and leashed or contained within a fence that is working. Please feel free to reach out if you have any questions.
