My name is Robert Lee and I have lived directly next door to Tim and their dog Chewy for the past 5 years. I am writing this letter voluntarily to provide my personal observations and testimony regarding Chewy's temperament and behavior.

I see Chewy almost every day—when he is in the yard, on supervised walks with his owner, and during the many times he has interacted with me and my family. Chewy has always been friendly, gentle, and polite in every interaction. He greets people with a wagging tail, enjoys being petted, and has never shown any sign of aggression toward any person or animal in my presence.


I am aware of a recent incident in which Chewy reportedly ran out of the house and barked at another dog being walked nearby. While I was not present at the exact moment of that incident, I can confidently state that this type of barking is completely out of character for Chewy based on years of daily observation. Chewy is a typical happy, energetic dog who sometimes barks out of excitement or curiosity—especially toward other dogs—but he has never displayed aggressive behavior, attempted to bite, or caused harm to anyone. In my experience, when Chewy has met other dogs (on leash and under his owner's control), he is playful and sociable, not aggressive.

Chewy is clearly a much-loved family pet who brings joy to everyone around him. Labeling him as aggressive or dangerous would not reflect the dog I have known and interacted with almost daily for 5 years.
